

## **Other Places to Check for Possible Funding (Scholarships, Fellowships, Grants, etc.)**

### **Cal Grant Extension**

Undergraduate Cal Grant A and B recipients who plan to enroll in a teaching credential program (TCP) after they receive their bachelor's degree may be eligible to renew their Cal Grant award for an additional year. The additional year of payment is provided to students who are seeking an initial teaching credential and cannot be used for other graduate level courses of study.

Offered through the University of California Office of the President, this fellowship funds UC students who plan to work in high-need California public schools. It was awarded at least at the Gervitz Graduate School of Education (UCSB) in 2019. ### **NSF Noyce Scholarships through Cal Teach at UCSC (also offered at other Universities)**

Provided by NSF & AAAS, the Robert Noyce Teacher Scholarship Program responds to the critical need for K-12 teachers of STEM by providing funding for those completing their teacher credential. For Cal Teach UCSC's version of the NSF Noyce Scholarship, recipients must work in a high-need school district for at least two years after completing the UCSC MA/C program.

### **TEACH Grant**

The Teacher Education Assistance for College and Higher Education (TEACH) Grant is a government-provided grant that can provide up to \$4,000 a year to students completing or planning to complete a teacher credential. You must teach at a high-need elementary, secondary school, or educational service agency for at least 4 years within 8 years of completing your teacher credential.

## **Pell Grant**

In some cases, a student enrolled in a post baccalaureate teacher certification program might receive a Federal Pell Grant (typically Pell Grants are only awarded to undergraduates).

## **California DREAM Loan Program**

Currently, undocumented students who graduate from a California high school and meet the California Dream Act requirements are eligible for state and university aid, but ineligible for federal aid (including federal loans). The DREAM loan program, funded by the state and UC, aims to close that gap and provide eligible students with the opportunity to borrow student loans to help pay for their education.

## **National Council of Teachers of Mathematics Prospective 7-12 Secondary Teacher Course Work Scholarships**

Prospective 7-12 Secondary Teacher Course Work Scholarships. For 2019-2020, one scholarship with a maximum value of \$10,000 will be awarded to a person currently completing their sophomore year of college, scheduling for full-time study at a four- or five-year college or university in the next academic year, and pursuing a career goal of becoming a certified teacher of secondary school mathematics
